

SSEBE Teaching Award 2020 Call for Nominations Deadline: March 31, 2021

This award may be presented annually to a faculty member in the School of Sustainable Engineering and the Built Environment (professor of practice, lecturer, or assistant/ associate/full professor) who has demonstrated excellence and innovation in teaching and student learning.

In addition to recognition at the Annual SSEBE Celebration of Excellence, the faculty member will be given \$1500 in her/his discretionary account to support scholarly activities of choice.

Nominations

Nominations should be in the form of a nominating letter (two pages or less) plus any supporting materials that illustrate the nature and significance of the activity. The nominating letter should:

- Describe the primary activity and accomplishment that supports consideration for the SSEBE Teaching Award.
- Explain how this activity and accomplishment promotes the achievement of excellence and innovation in teaching and learning for students in the School.

Nominations must include a citation of no more than 50 words, highlighting the reasons for the nomination; this citation will be used in the program and award plaque if the nominee is selected for this award.

All nomination materials should be submitted to Judy Reedy at <u>judy.reedy@asu.edu</u>. Self-nominations are welcome. Past winners are eligible after three years.

Selection Process

The SSEBE Awards Committee will evaluate the nominations and make a recommendation to the Director of the School, who will make the final decision on the award recipient(s).



Award Criteria

The award is intended to recognize exemplary pedagogical activities with a focus on innovations and accomplishments of the recent past. Criteria considered by the committee include, but are not limited to:

- Does the activity/accomplishment constitute a transformative innovation that is significantly above and beyond regular pedagogical improvements that faculty make over time?
- How has the pedagogical innovation and activity advanced student outcomes, hard and soft skills, experiential learning, workforce development, and workplace readiness?
- Does the activity advance the mission and vision of the School and its varied stakeholders?
- Does the activity advance the causes of Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (JEDI)?
- Does the activity bring special visibility and recognition to the School?
- Does the activity engage multiple stakeholders, individuals, or groups within and beyond the School?
- What is the nature of feedback received from students and employers regarding the pedagogical activity/innovation and its effectiveness?

Deadline

The nomination materials should be submitted electronically. The entire nomination package must be submitted by **March 31, 2021**.
