How Much?

- *Each scholarship will be for \$3,000:* \$1,500/fall 2023 and \$1,500/spring 2024.

How Many?

- AFMA intends to award multiple scholarships this year. *One could be to you!*

Who's Eligible?

- Undergraduates that are *at least sophomores (Apply during Freshman year or later)*
- *Graduate students*
- Must be majoring in a water resource related field (see following pages for eligible majors). Interested? Does my major qualify? Ask Ryan and he will be happy to let you know.
- Students of ASU, UofA, NAU, and/or another accredited school where the recipient demonstrates strong ties to Arizona.

A. Scholarship Established

The Arizona Floodplain Management Association (AFMA) has established a scholarship for students enrolled in water resource related majors.

B. Purpose of the Scholarship

This scholarship is established for the purpose of promoting the education of water resource professionals in order to help meet the goals of AFMA. The purpose and objective of AFMA is to provide a means of local representation on a statewide basis regarding policies and activities dealing with floodplain management within Arizona. This includes promoting the common interest in flood hazard mitigation, enhancing cooperation between the various related private, local, state, and federal agencies, and encouraging and ensuring new and innovative approaches to managing the state's floodplains.

C. Scholarship Overview:

1. An award of \$3,000 per student per school year may be granted, disbursed one-half for fall semester and one-half for spring semester.
2. Relatives of AFMA members are eligible. AFMA members with friends or family members applying for a scholarship must recuse themselves from the review and award process.
3. A target of a minimum of one undergraduate or one graduate scholarship per year. AFMA reserves the right to not grant any scholarships in any given year or grant multiple scholarships to qualifying applicants.
4. Scholarship funds may be used for tuition, books, student housing, and water resources related conferences or professional development course registration fees.
5. Scholarship applications will be accepted, reviewed, and awarded by the AFMA Board of Directors with administrative support from the university.
6. The AFMA Board of Directors will administer the scholarship funds.

D. AFMA Scholarship Award Criteria:

1. The criteria for the AFMA Scholarship are defined on the following pages under the Scholarship Application section.

E. Procedure

Final scholarship recipients shall be selected by AFMA from ASU, UofA, NAU, and/or another accredited school where the recipient demonstrates strong ties to Arizona. The annual scholarship award(s) will be disbursed one-half for fall semester and one-half for spring semester to one or more students enrolled at these universities.

PURPOSE

This scholarship is established for the purpose of promoting the education of water resource professionals in order to help meet the goals of the Arizona Floodplain Management Association.

CRITERIA

1. Student must major in one of the following areas of study:
 - Civil Engineering (with water resources emphasis),
 - Water Resources including surface water hydrology and hydraulics,
 - Watershed Management,
 - Environmental Engineering,
 - Agricultural Engineering,
 - Geomorphology, or
 - Enrolled in a floodplain management accredited program approved by the AFMA Board of Directors.
2. Undergraduates:
 - Applicant must be a minimum 2nd year (sophomore) student and have completed 30 credit hours for the year the scholarship applies. At the time of application for this scholarship, applicant must have completed at least 15 credit hours.
 - Applicant must show a minimum of 6-credit hours in one of the fields of study listed above by the end of the two semesters for which the scholarship applies. The 6-hours can either be passed in previous semesters or 3-hours enrolled in the semester for which the scholarship will first apply, and 3-hours in the following semester.
3. Graduates: Must be enrolled in a master's program with emphasis on one of the fields listed above.
4. The applicant must provide a two-page written statement including the following:
 - Explanation of why the applicant applied for a scholarship from AFMA.
 - Description of the applicant's professional goals for the future and how this scholarship will help the applicant achieve those goals.
 - Demonstration of past or on-going leadership in an area related to water resources, such as serving in a student professional society and/or including a list and description of student awards received.
5. Applicant must submit at least one letter of recommendation from the applicant's professors in the water resources field, student advisor, or from water resources professionals in the community. A second letter of recommendation is highly advised, but not required.
6. Applicant must maintain full-time student status for the period that the scholarship applies.
7. Applicant must maintain a 3.0 minimum GPA and provide a copy of applicant's university transcripts.
8. Applicant must be a US citizen or a permanent resident of the US.
9. Preference will be given to AFMA members including AFMA student members. Applicants are encouraged to visit the AFMA website at www.azfma.org for more information about AFMA.
10. Preference may be given to students who meet all the above criteria and demonstrate a financial need by incorporating economic circumstances into their written statement. Final determination of need will be decided by AFMA. All information submitted in this regard will be treated as confidential, used only for scholarship application evaluation, and seen only by the review committee.
